


NHS

MathCounts is a club here at Conemaugh Township designed for middle school students in grades 6-8. This competition helps students use their problem-solving skills while working on their teamwork and individual achievement. Led and taught by Mr. Rising, students such as Landon Oaks, Elijah Marsh, Devin Lohr, and Kelson Kramer have been competing for all three years. The competition consists of two rounds. The first round is the "sprint round." In this round, participants face 30 questions in just 40 minutes, without the use of a calculator. The second round is the "target round." In the "target round," students are given eight questions, with a calculator allowed. Each January, schools host their local MathCounts competition, where students compete individually and as part of a team. The winners advance to the Chapter Competition at the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown. Past teams have done exceptionally well, with some students advancing to the state level.
